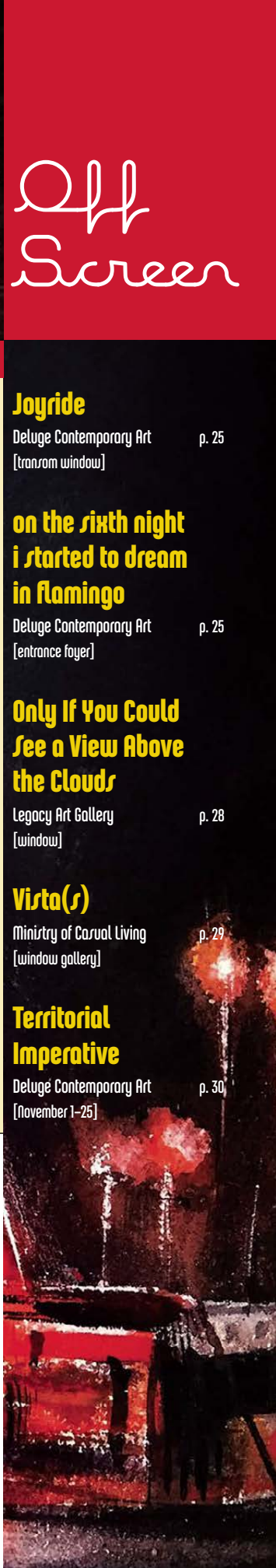

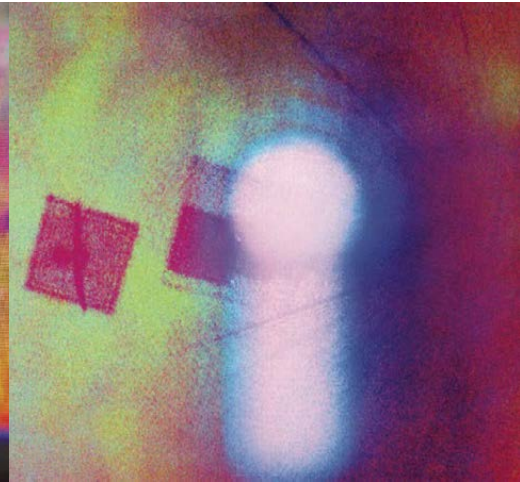

A remix of sounds and images from the Prelinger archives that showcases technology and machines.

Pixelz of the Orient

Warren Chan | 2022 | Canada | 9 min | W Cdn Premiere

Pixelz of the Orient appropriates Western media depictions of East Asia for a psychedelic and comedic exploration of ahistorical East Asian aesthetics and identity. Western film and television depicts East Asian culture through a pastiche of Chinese and Japanese symbols—often mixed with other influences from across Asia—filtered through an Orientalist lens that associates this “Asianness” with the exotic and mysterious.

In Littleness

Cherlyn Hring-Hrin Liu | 2022 | USA | 8 min | Cdn Premiere

The film was shot on a regular 8mm camera and is presented in unslit form as 16mm, a screening format commonly referred to as double 8mm. When I first came into contact with this medium, I was deeply attracted by its miniature size. Eight millimetres is a very small space on which to store images. It reminds me of all kinds of things from childhood: ephemeral, wonderful, changeable. Recalling that as a child I spent most of my time with my nanny, I decided to zoom in on daily life, especially trivial household chores. At the same time, the particles and dust of the childhood world are magnified.

Interference Pattern

Ramey Newell, Niccolò Bigagli | 2022 | Canada/USA | 9 min | Cdn Premiere

Light. Sound. Matter. Intricate landscapes emerge from multitudinous overlapping waves of film and quantum physics. A collaborative film co-directed by filmmaker Ramey Newell and quantum physics PhD candidate Niccolò Bigagli as part of Imagine Science Film Festival's 2022 Symbiosis film competition. Filmed on location in an Ultracold Quantum Matter lab at Columbia University in New York City

Bye Bye Now

Louise Bourque | 2022 | Canada | 8 min | W Cdn Premiere

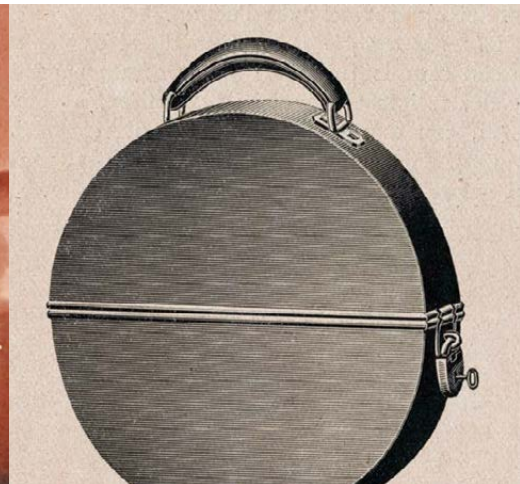
Waving hello to the filming cameraperson, the subjects through this very gesture, are also providing a future viewer with the acknowledgment of a constant good-bye to a fleeting moment. Yet when the film is projected and the captured gesture is seen, it's as if the subjects are saying hello again from the past. This film is an homage to the artist's father, the man behind the camera in these personal family archives.

Manuale di cinematografia per dilettanti: Vol. 1 [A Companion for Amateur Cinematographers: Vol. 1]

Federico Di Corato | 2022 | Italy/Ethiopia | 20 min | Cdn Premiere

Set against the backdrop of Italy in the years of the fascist dictatorship, a man of means, yet unknown to history, scrutinizes the world through his small cine camera. Guiding him and teaching him is a manual; the buds of ideology are detectable beneath the seemingly impartial tone it uses to describe technique. But in his films, the ineffable signs of resistance still rise to the surface.

Alex MacKenzie | 2023 | Canada | 6 min | World Premiere

A readymade of sorts, animating the tarmac as landing protocols fuse with painted arrows and guidelines on bruised asphalt. Distinct concrete squared segments are reinterpreted as film frames flickering past, with this hypnotic and immersive taxiing finally giving way to a rush of unbuckling.

Skyscraper Film

Federica Foglia | 2023 | Canada/Italy | 8 min | W Cdn Premiere

Skyscraper Film is a camera-less handmade film collage created from scraps of 16mm orphan films from the 1970s. Originally produced to promote tourism in North America, these films are remediated by the filmmaker to create an abstract collage via the Emulsion Lifting/Emulsion Grafting technique. With this technique, the filmmaker lifts by hand the emulsion layer from the film base and subsequently places it on a different film base and in this way a celluloid collage is created, then re-animated.

Dissolution

Rennie Taylor | 2022 | Canada | 3 min | W Cdn Premiere

What does a building look like on the verge of demolition? Typically, there is no fanfare. Some, however, peek through the tiny metal meshes while the wrecking ball gets its due and wonder what was. The structure of 888 Dupont has had many functions throughout the years. Once, it was a broom factory for veterans with disabilities. At its most recent iteration, it served as an oasis for artists over many decades.

NE Corridor

Jarhva Gen Jolondz | 2022 | USA | 7 min | W Cdn Premiere

“Accumulated over three years, Solondz’s film is a crowded collage of gurgling paint, jagged splices, errant sprocket holes and puzzling images that conjure the densely material frames of the late queer avant-garde filmmaker Luther Price. A messy assemblage in purples and oranges, *NE Corridor* is at once a visceral explosion of color and a tortured object.”

Clear Ice Fern

Mark Street | 2023 | USA | 12 min | Cdn Premiere

Images shot through architectural glass on Super 8 film in the dead of night in NYC. The title refers to one of the glass samples I used to frame up images of Times Square and other nightspots in NYC. The city peeks its head in as an off screen character, but the glass bends and twists it in its own warped and wonderful way. Music by Erik Friedlander.

NYC RGB

Viktoria Schmid | 2023 | Austria | 7 min | W Cdn Premiere

NYC RGB is part of a series of works in which Viktoria Schmid deals with historical colour film processes. Using a special technique of colour separation through RGB filters, the real temporal dimension can be concentrated on a cinematic triple exposure. The film strip was sent through the camera three times, exposing the material with a different colour filter on each pass. First red, green, then blue.

Vesitornisinfonia [Water Tower Symphony]

Panu Johansson | 2023 | Finland | 20 min | NA Premiere

A tribute to water towers and the memories associated with them in the form of an experimental film. As the title suggests, the piece gives the spotlight to Finnish water towers, the real eye-catchers of the local constructed environment. According to recent studies these towers have become town symbols that create local identity. *Vesitornisinfonia* not only documents, but also revives this kind of everyday environment typical to Finland. These slowly disappearing surreal buildings deserve to be depicted through art: they deserve a visual symphony of their own.

Nirxa Platzer | 2022 | Canada/Cuba | 90 min | Vic Premiere

back home follows the filmmaker's pursuit to get to know her older brother, Josh, twenty years after he took his own life. Over a five year period, she connects with the friends who knew him best as a teenager—his found family. Through intimate recollections re-imagined on 16mm and Super 8 film, and lyrical, celluloid visuals hand-processed in plants, seaweed, soil and ashes, *back home* floats between memory and present time in a fragmented meditation on identity, loss and healing: exploring the transformative power of grieving in community.

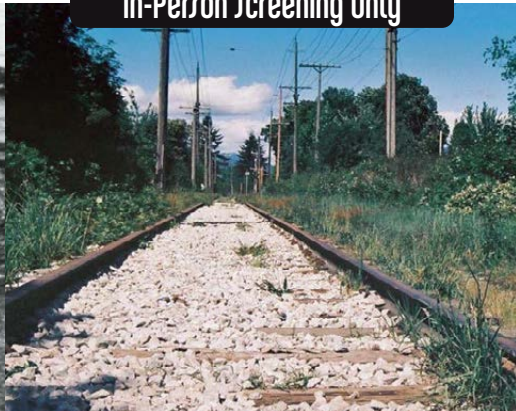

Jesa

Jonathan V Lee | 2022 | USA | 8 min | W Cdn Premiere

Made after the passing of the filmmaker's grandfather, *Jesa* is a film dealing with themes of intergenerational trauma and its inherited effects

on intimacy and family by reconstructing traditional Korean funerary rites. Exploring the effects of colonization and post-war memory on the intimate scale of family, *Jesa* uses song, stories and recollections of the past to wrestle with the questions of how we exist together after trauma.

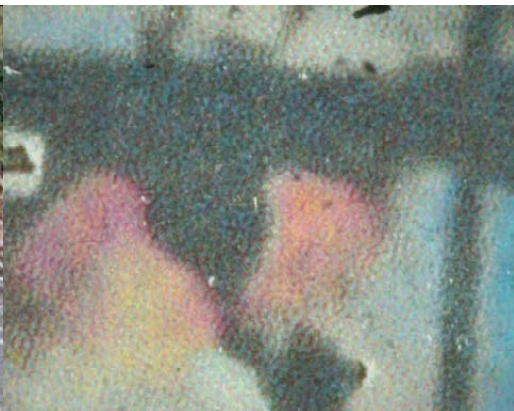
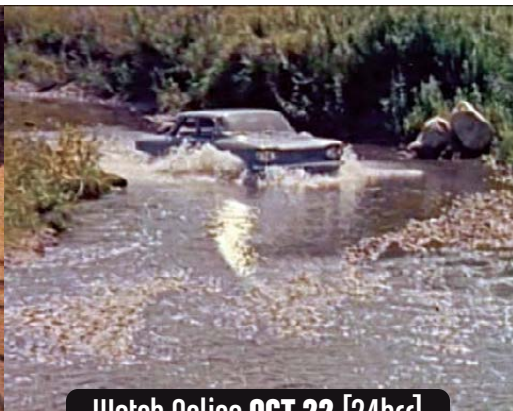
Sebastian Marcano-Perez | 2022 | USA | 9 min | Cdn Premiere

A personal essay film dives into the collective memory of a family and the home in Venezuela they had to leave behind.

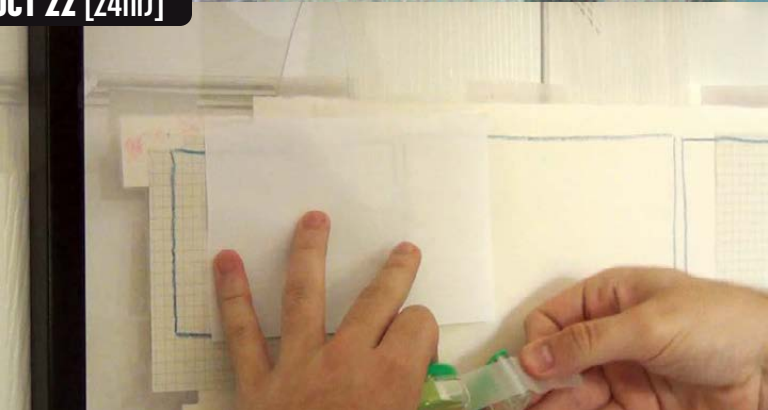
This Line Connects the Void

Trom Quynh Nghiem | 2023 | Canada | 16 min | W Cdn Premiere

Filed in the artist's family apartment on the edge of Parkdale in the city of Toronto, this work explores the poetics of grief and precarity for the family around the time of death and dying regarding the artist's sister. With non-linear storytelling and fragmented images, the work moves between speculative fiction, documentary and experimental film. Referencing Theresa Hak Kyung Cha's *Dictée* (1982) and Anne Carson's poem *On Walking Backwards* (1995), it considers the space and metaphor of a void and the desire that moves between the dead and living.

Heat Spells

Sarah Ballard | 2023 | USA | 9 min | World Premiere

The Fountain of Youth mythology has forever changed the landscape of St. Augustine, Florida. Looking closely at Florida's commodified landscape, *Heat Spells* visits contemporary locations that claim to be the site of the Fountain of Youth in an attempt to capture the everlasting consequences of the mythical spring and its entanglement with the origins of colonialism in the United States.

Favourite Umbrellifers

Emily Peltring | 2023 | Canada | 4 min | W Cdn Premiere

This animation was created as a series of experiments with hand-processed 16mm film, collected and collaged to the sound: photographs of hair, confetti and sand, stop-motion sand animation, bleaching, toning and paint on film.

The Faded Landscape

Mingyong Cheng | 2022 | USA | 6 min | Cdn Premiere

The Faded Landscape is an animation co-created by AI and us. This animation is inspired by the story of a famous Chinese landscape painting *Thousands Li of Rivers and Mountains*, in which the artist adopted the lasting mineral pigment that created a striking blue and green landscape painting that remained unfaded for thousands of years. By viewing the historical transition from nature landscape to modern "concrete jungle" and the continuing impact of climate change, we collaborated with AI to create a journey based on a fusion of our concerns and AI memory.

Oculto [Hidden]

Sebastian Wiedemann | 2023 | Colombia/Peru | 9 min | NA Premiere

The celestial bodies enunciate something in the midst of their mystery. The moon turns red, the planet cries, the fall is deeper than we could imagine. Hidden, something lurks. In the middle, a requiem or perhaps an elegy. The uncertain as a path that leads us to a catastrophe that we do not know is past, present or future. But which is undoubtedly a deep memory of a dark secret. The broken whispers of a wounded jungle.

Picture a Forest

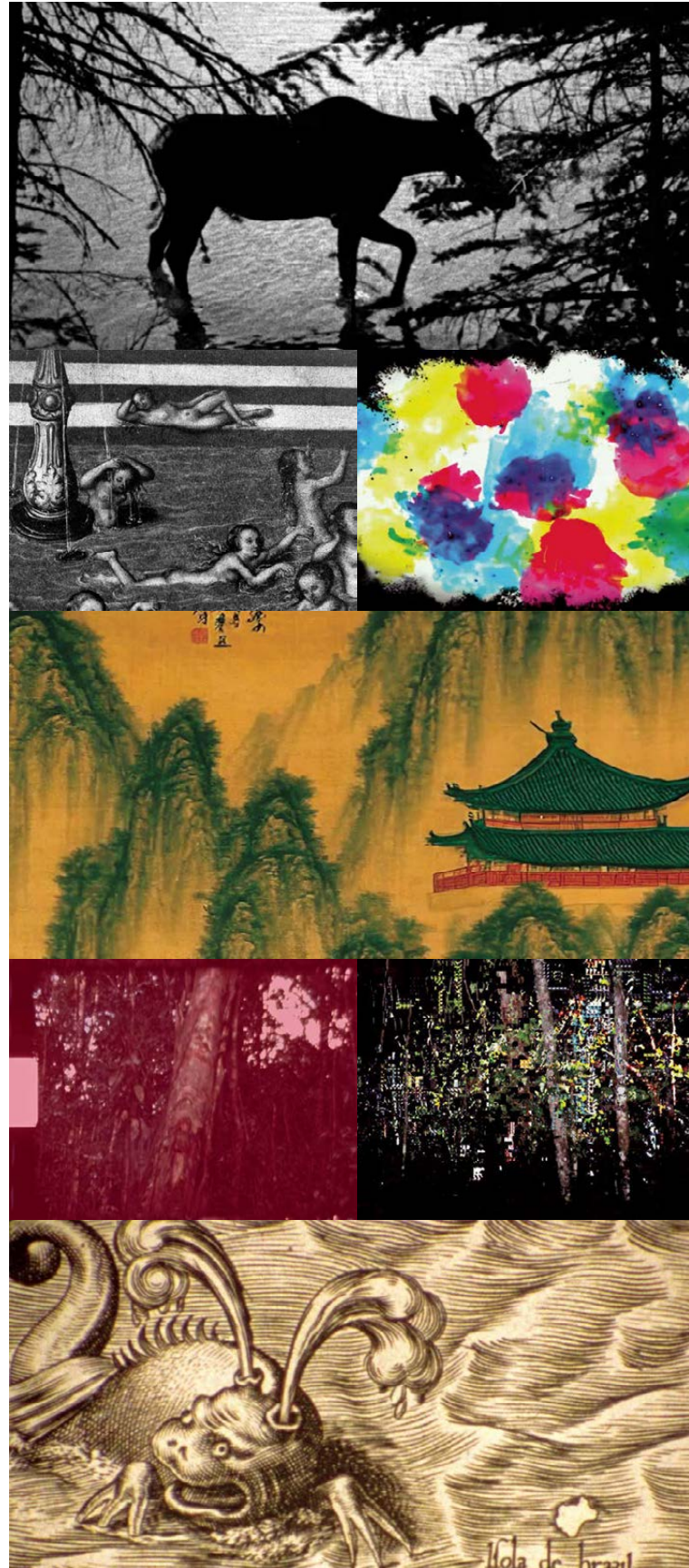
Dave Rodriguez | 2022 | USA | 4 min | Cdn Premiere

An anti-landscape performing its own impossible, inevitable annihilation. The north Florida woodlands fractured by strobe light, offering glimpses of its vitality and fragility. Over time, these flickering slices of the natural world become more corrupted and illegible, decaying into garbled data streams. As the forest fails to preserve itself, it demands that we recalibrate our vision.

Vision of Paradise

Leonardo Pirondi | 2022 | Brazil | 16 min | Cdn Premiere

The great voyages to the "New World" were seen as expanding the frontiers of the visible and displacing those of the invisible, therefore, maps from that time render the real and imaginary. The film follows a voyage of the Brazilian military in search of an imaginary island with the same name as their country. The mythical Hy-Brazil was known to exist to the west of Ireland and above the Fortunate Islands. *Vision of Paradise* is an examination of the capacity of the human imagination and computer simulations to construct environments. Amidst the fine threshold of the real, simulated and imagined, the film analyzes contemporary ideas of virtual reality and their ambition to expand the frontiers of the physical world into a "New World."

Frédéric Moffet | 2023 | Canada/USA | 8 min | Cdn Premiere

A film titled *Dance Movie* appears in many Warhol filmographies, but no work with this title can be found in the collection. The lost film, starring dancer Fred Herko gliding on a single roller skate, was shot in 1963. Accounts of it do exist, including Warhol's evocative description of Herko "gliding in dance attitudes and looking as perfect as the ornament on the hood of a car." *Goddess of Speed* poetically reimagines the missing film.

Today I Did Nothing

Kim Kielhofner | 2023 | Canada | 8 min | Cdn Premiere

Through a whirlwind of images, *Today I Did Nothing* proposes a hybrid essay narrative that weaves together quotes and ideas using a collection of objects. The work creates a personal archive, repeating its imagery to entice the viewer into its visual universe while at the same time presenting difficult contradictions.

Cameron Hletke | 2023 | Canada | 4 min | Vic Premiere

A dynamic journey through a woman's visual diaries, exploring human connection in young adulthood.

Sight Leak

Peng Zuqiang | 2022 | China/USA | 12 min | W Cdn Premiere

"The moon, the sometimes dark street, trees, it's warm [...] at last, a certain eroticism possible (that of the warm night)." When Roland Barthes visited China in 1973, he jotted down some notes that would become part of his *Travels in China (Carnets du voyage en Chine)*, an underplot of desire in his imagination of the country. Barthes did not publish these writings during his lifetime, and his unsettling judgments about China are refracted in Peng Zuqiang's work *Sight Leak*, as fragments of dialogues on class and looking, responding to the reflections on the same matters elicited alongside Barthes' sense of eroticism. The local tourist in the film travels through different spaces and gatherings, seemingly never looking at anyone, yet silently looking at someone, turning towards a certain collectivity in spite of a foreign homoerotic gaze.

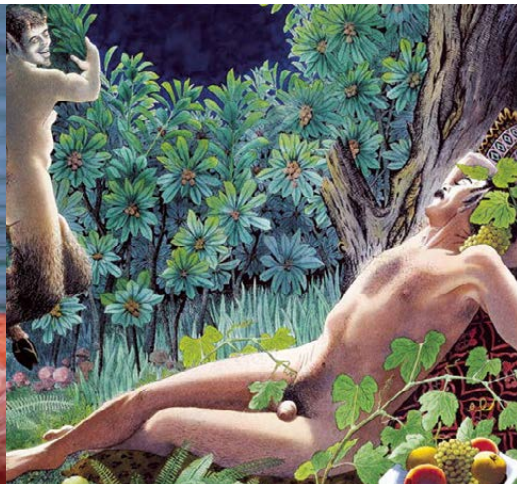

Josh Drake, James Hollenbaugh, Jeremy Morr, Caleb Smith | 2023 | USA | 4 min | Cdn Premiere

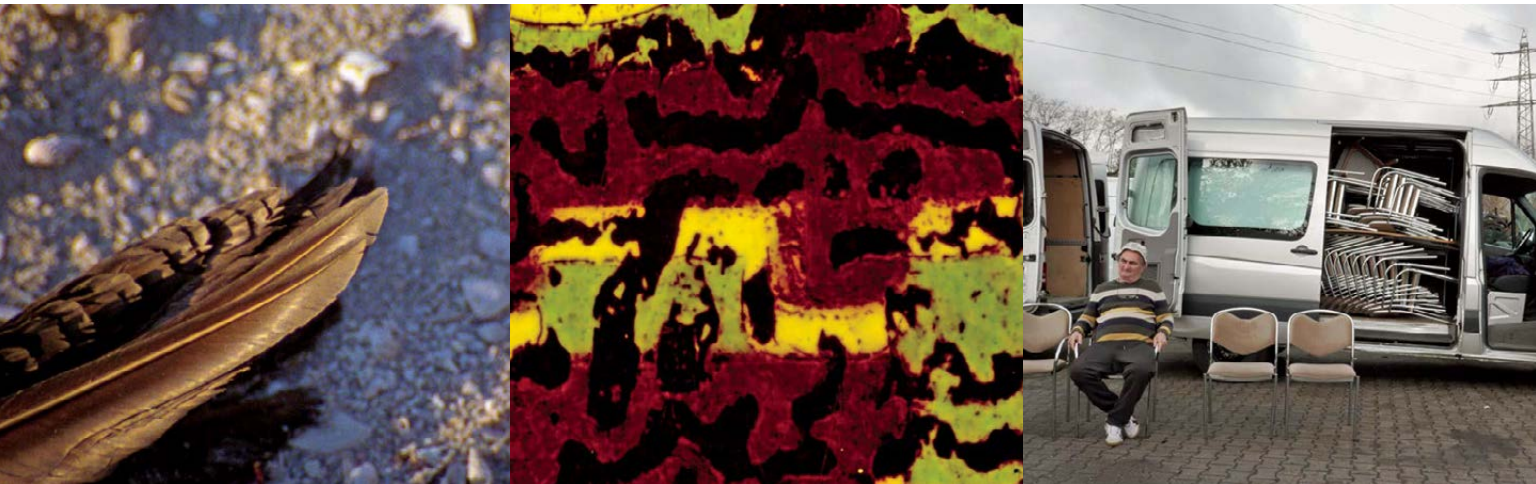
A collaborative Dadaist/exquisite corpse film on the theme of waste by four members of the Harrisburg-based collective Moviate.

Made in Europe

Zauri Matikarhveli | 2023 | Georgia/Germany/Netherlands | 25 min | World Premiere

For more than 30 years, my father has been travelling from Georgia to Germany or the Netherlands to buy second-hand cars, preferably Mercedes Sprinter vans. He packs them full of bicycles and furniture such as used leather sofas, chairs and tables. For some years now, he has also been buying scrap cars. He dismantles them into their components, which he sends to Georgia by container, often on behalf of Georgian wholesalers. Then my father drives 4,800 kilometres back to Georgia in a Sprinter alone. Spare parts and second-hand goods from Europe are valuable enough in Georgia to sell them for a small profit, despite the high cost of travel. This is how my father earns his living in the international flow of goods—under difficult conditions: hard physical work, health hazards, separation from his family and poor accommodations.

A close look at the aftermath of a historic landslide near Hope, BC. Vast and uncompromising, the scene presents a complex dialectic of destruction and regeneration. Yee, *Hope Slide* progresses akin to a slow exhalation, evoking a contemplative melancholy of relief at a geological pace.

Johannes Gierlinger, Mira Klug | 2023 | Austria/Slovakia | 9 min | Cdn Premiere

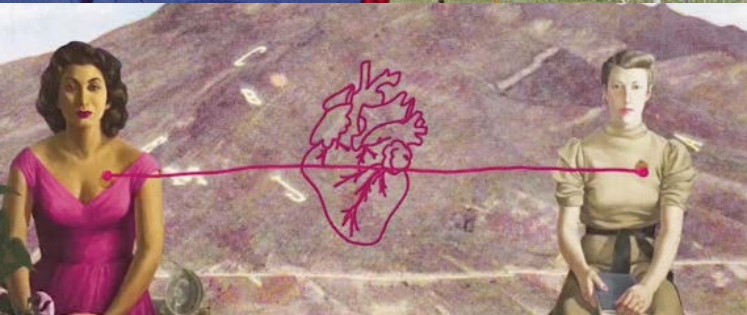
Beginning with a historical painting of an idyllic March landscape, stored in an art depot, the film moves along the border river March, which with its Austrian-Slovakian section establishes one of Austria's oldest national borders. The film poses questions about image storage, escape and the reverberations of historical circumstances. 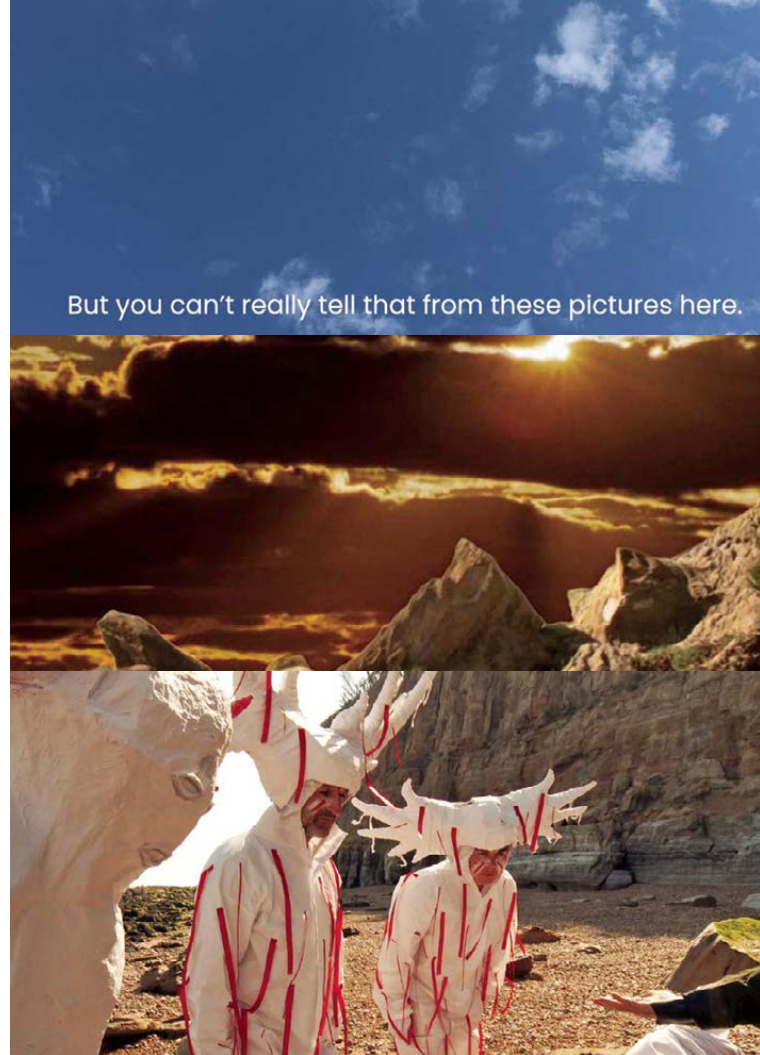
The Great Curdling

A funeral cult has formed, worshipping this new phenomena. They are teaching the exiled women how to re-format the colonized, curdled bodies of the dead into a new substance.

The gentle Paul themes with flute, acoustic guitar and mello-tron contrast with the Demonic Roman Empire themes of electric guitar, drums and synth. Performance artist Linda Mary Montano and Usama Alshaibi portray Paul on his journey.

The film tries to capture the disturbing reaction Paul and his letters had in the early days of Christianity. The use of live action, animation, found footage and original music was a way to recover his biography from the brains of 20th Century humans so that in some perhaps misguided Utopian impulse, we can build something new out of it for the future.

"Holy reconstructions of the sons of God, Jim Finn! Our favorite political atomizer gets holy in his new documentary crusade and decides to tell the story of Paul, the apostle who, the cheap internet would say, was "the most ardent propagandist of Christianity." Finn, alongside artists Montano and Alshaibi, goes all scissorhands using 16mm institutional shorts, board game commercials, cassette tapes, trashy animations and, of course, period performances of not-so-doubtful quality—a rosary of archive footage that evolves in the map of pop culture, its praying and its saints. Psychedelic and ferocious, Finn extracts waste from the 20th century and, Doc Brown-style, uses it to make miracles based on science (that of film) that stare into the future." – Juan Manuel Dominguez, BAFICI

VHS to digital. Fast forward and slowed down. A synthesis of the digital and the analog glitch. *Joyride* is part two of an ongoing Elvis video-cycle.

The remix of an existing work contradicts the idea that the meaning of this work is fixed forever and can only exist in one context. Instead, remix films circulate alternative narratives of popular works, all the while being suspicious of conventions and authorities.

Dina Yanni is a video artist and researcher whose work is influenced by popular culture, digital image manipulation and critical theory. She creates video work that utilizes existing footage, experimental editing and data corruption to reveal, reevaluate and reframe power structures discovered in the original materials. Yanni also publishes theory-based work around the study of power structures behind visual representations and possibilities for counter-narratives. Hello Dankness opens in a suburban neighborhood in early 2016, in the lead up to the November presidential election. Here, we meet Tom Hanks (from *The Burbs*) whose enthusiasm for Bernie Sanders is a thorn in the side of neighbor Annette Bening (*American Beauty*), an ardent Hillary Clinton supporter. A few houses down, Bruce Dern (*The Burbs*) plays the role of the Trad Republican, a camo-wearing, flag-raising conservative who is being riled by his neighbor Ice Cube (*Next Friday*), who encourages his Chihuahua to poop on Dern's lawn. The only Trump supporter on the block is a mysterious loner whose ramshackle house seethes with gothic foreboding. These are the political dynamics of the before-times of the American mythos, when political differences took the form of competing lawn signs and warring words over picket fences. But perhaps the real villain of this narrative resides elsewhere. In a garage at the end of the street, Mark Zuckerberg (played by Jesse Eisenberg) sits at his computer in a hoodie, altering the course of history one friend at a time.

Hello Dankness follows this group of neighbors through the years 2016 to 2021, as their shared reality disintegrates into conspiracies and other contagions. Politics in America have always been divisive, but what emerges after 2016 is not just discordance but dankness. It's a time of presidents with pee-pee tapes, baby-eating Democrats, child-trafficking in Wayfair furniture and Corona virus conspiracies implicating Bill Gates, China and 5G towers. Instead of trying to smoke out the facts from the fake-news, *Hello Dankness* leans into these mythologies, attempting to make visible what they may reveal and obscure about the deep cultural fissures and devastating material conditions that characterize this moment. As the 2020 election heads towards resolution in Act 6, some will rejoice and others will revolt, and Mark Zuckerberg will remain smarmy and indignant while a zombie bleeds out at his feet.

Loosely based on the erotic poem “Caurapañcāśikā” by Bilhana, which was written in prison upon discovery of the poet’s clandestine affair with Princess Yaminipurnatilaka. The verses were written while awaiting judgment, not knowing if he was to be executed or exiled—his fate is unknown. *Lotus-Eyed Girl* ruminates on the curious and fractured inter-sections of death, desire and class. Fading family photographs (from an uncle’s funeral to my mother on her wedding day), pomegranate arils, pulsating floral mandalas and horror atmospherics culminate into an ec-static collision of death and longing—echoing devastations of the past.

They're all dead

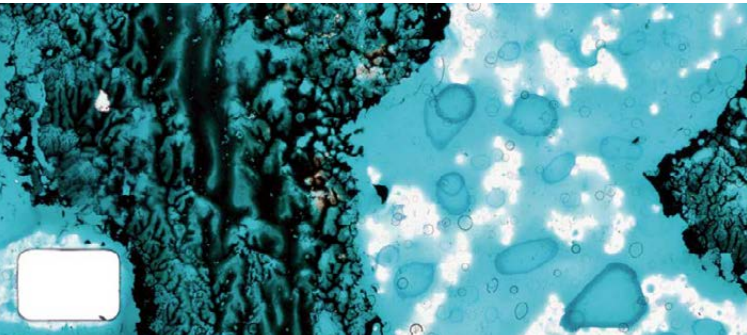
Marija Benito | 2023 | Spain | 7 min | Cdn Premiere

The cinematic work models itself after Romero's cult classics which birthed the American cinematic zombie against the deindustrializing backdrop of Western Pennsylvania.

Territorial Imperative

Territorial Imperative explores issues around ecology, colonialism, commodified landscapes and interspecies communication with media installations by Sarah Ballard, Big Top Collective, Yusuf Demirors, Kimberly Forero-Arniás, Janelle VanderKelen and Sebastian Wiedemann. The six works presented here—all made on analog, celluloid film—engage with imperialist motivations, the environmental effects of late capitalism, traditional ecological knowledge and the regenerative power of nature.

Heat Spell

Sarah Ballard | 2023 | USA | 9 min

Heat Spells identifies tourism as the eternal reenactment of manifest destiny and the Fountain of Youth as a myth that underwrites the American dream. As myth and history conflate to obscure the imperialist motivations behind Ponce de Leon, the film responds by embodying feverish experience of the “explorer’s” search for eternal youth, an act which parallels the compulsory capture inherent in tourist photography.

Sarah Ballard (she/they) is a filmmaker and educator whose work concerns hauntological subjects—afterimages of colonialism, ghosts of the working class and political residues of hysteria. Her work has screened at festivals such as Crossroads, Antimatter, San Diego Underground Film Festival, Engauge Experimental Film Festival, Onion City Experimental Film Festival and Montreal Independent Film Festival. She is a recipient of the 2023 Princess Grace Award in Film and received her MFA in Cinematic Arts from the University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee, Peck School of the Arts.

garden path

Big Top Collective | 2023 | Canada | 3 min

garden path dives deeply into a meditative engagement with the forest. Shot on black and white 16mm film and hand processed with coffee-based eco-developer, the film is the first part of Big Top’s new project Wild Forest, underlining the regenerative power of nature to offer hope in



the face of climate change. The soundtrack features the voices of Big Top Collective members in overlapping vocal harmony.

Big Top Collective is Trace Nelson and Peter Sandmark. Their media works often combine imagery captured from various sources while walking through forests, gardens or while travelling and feature gestural camera movements and hand painted film transformed in the post-production process via layering and abstraction. **Trace Nelson** is a multidisciplinary artist working in visual and media art and music who has exhibited her work in Canada, the USA and Europe. She has worked as an art educator over the past 28 years, teaching at Concordia University, Vancouver Island School of Art and the University of Victoria. **Peter Sandmark** has been creating single channel experimental film works since 1978. He has taught various filmmaking and film studies courses at Concordia University and the University of Victoria. Sandmark has also worked for media art cen-



tres in Canada such as Main Film and IMAA in Montreal and FLUX media gallery in Victoria. Nelson and Sandmark live and work in Victoria on the unceded territory of the Lekwungen peoples

Suya Dokun [Touch the Water]

Yusuf Demirors | 2023 | USA | 8 min

A lost and amnesiac narrator explores the toxic and alien waterways of New York City in order to discover his relationship to this environment and what it means to be human.

Yusuf Demirors was born in Turkey, where he started his journey as a lens-based artist through film photography and alternative printing techniques. He is currently a sociology PhD student at The New School of Social Research, where he is researching the social relations of production entailed by gendered materialities under contemporary capitalism through an interdisciplinary lens. His experimental work in filmmaking and photography often explores themes of immigration, ecological imaginaries and post-industrial landscapes as ways of resituating our knowledge of the material world around us.

Kimberly Forero-Arnias | 2023 | Colombia/USA | 10 min

Field journal entries, both mine and others, are ground together to explore what is filtered and what remains as families of fauna and flora move from one environment to another.

In one generation the ecological knowledge my family gained living on a coffee farm in Colombia has been filtered out. Looking to the former generation to root myself, this film is composed of observations made by family members of a place that existed as a present-tense for them over 35 years ago as well as in my current place of residence, the unceded land of the Wampanoag and Massachusett peoples (Boston). These observations take the form of Whatsapp messages, drawings, historical field journals and handwritten descriptive texts straddling multiple time periods and geographical locations.

This project is in conversation with the scientific field notebook as a technology that helped structure a very specific way of engaging in the act of observation; one of categories and compartmentalization that sustains dislocation and places pressure on the nature of "belonging." *recortes* intertwines personal, community and historical observations, and explores observation as a collaborative process that intermingles the past and future into present tense rhizomatic observations.

Kimberly Forero-Arnias (she/ella) is an experimental animator whose work has screened across the United States as well as internationally at festivals including Rotterdam, Ann Arbor, Images and Edinburgh. She is the recipient of various awards including the SMFA Traveling Fellowship, Massachusetts Cultural Council Fellowship and the Film Studies Center Fellowship at Harvard.



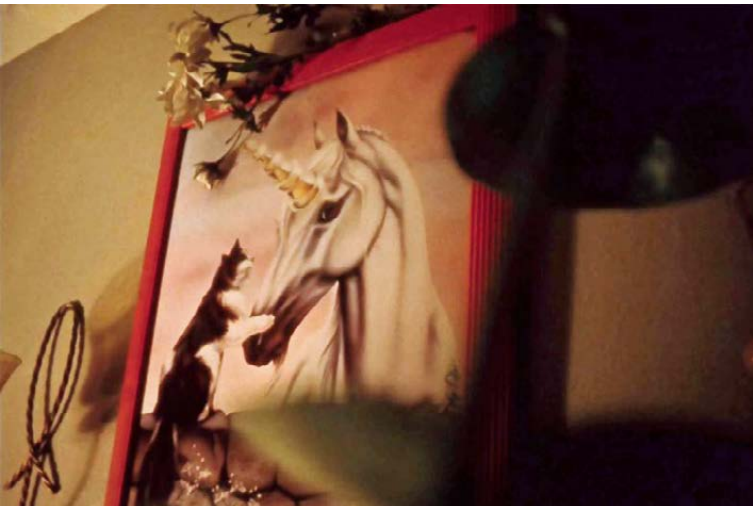

Sebastian Wiedemann | 2023 | Colombia/Peru | 9 min

The celestial bodies enunciate something in the midst of their mystery. The moon turns red, the planet cries, the fall is deeper than we could imagine. Hidden, something lurks. In the middle, a requiem or perhaps an elegy. The uncertain as a path that leads us to a catastrophe that we do not know is past, present or future. But which is undoubtedly a deep memory of a dark secret. The broken whispers of a wounded jungle.

Sebastian Wiedemann is a Colombian filmmaker-researcher and philosopher-practitioner of cinematic modes of experience. His works investigate liminal intersections animated through experimental cinema and philosophy, aware of a possibility for thought-cinema as living poetic ecology and a surface for the affirmation of a cosmopolitics of image. His award-winning films including *Obatala Film* and *Deep Blue* have screened in venues around the world and at retrospectives in Colombia, Brazil, Mexico, Spain and Ireland. In 2015 Wiedemann's *Los (De)pendientes* was included in *Artforum's* list of the best films of the year and in 2017 his *Abismo* was included in the film series *Ism Ism Ism: Experimental Cinema in Latin America* at Los Angeles Filmforum.



Language Unknown

Janelle VanderKelen | 2022 | USA/Spain | 6 min

Language Unknown embraces plant sentience as fact and speculates how beings of the vegetal variety might approach interspecies communication with humans (who are far more sensorially limited). Leaves, mycelium and roots playfully examine how humans experience the world, and the (supposedly) silent watchers consider what language those swift blurs of human might possibly understand.

Janelle VanderKelen is an artist, curator and educator currently based in Knoxville TN. Her films and intermedia installations imagine alternative acts of relation between imperfect bodies (human, vegetal, geological or otherwise) and make visible the agency of plants through experimental time-based media processes. VanderKelen's work has been exhibited at institutions including the Boulder Museum of Contemporary Art, Anthol-
